2020 Highlights

- Instituting COVID protocols, we managed to safely continue to serve our families in need, five days a week.
- We moved to a larger location in the Athens County Job and Family Services building, consolidating our main distribution and storage. This move streamlined our operations and reduced our annual rent and utility expenses by 47%.
- Created the Joe Burrow Hunger Relief
 Fund at the Foundation for Appalachian
 Ohio with \$350,000 from our Joe
 Burrow-inspired donations. Matched by
 the state, and with additional donations,
 this endowment is currently valued at
 over \$1 million dollars. Fund proceeds
 will be available for payout in 2024.
- We planned for an "On the Road" program, with Saturday outreach into different communities around the county starting in January of 2021.
- We started the process for an independent audit of our financial situation and our stewardship of our donations.



The Need

One in 5 people in Athens County is food insecure. That's an estimated 12,900 people before COVID-19.

It would cost \$35,475 to serve every one of them 3 days of food – one time!
